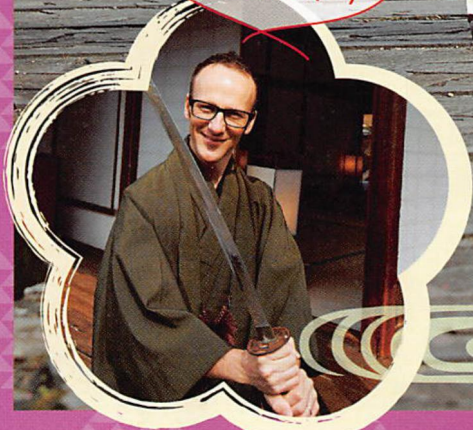

# The only sandwich-shaped

## Little Kyoto Kitsuki

The town puts you in the mood to wear a kimono.

Kitsuki was the first castle town in the country to be certified as a "historic townscape where kimonos look right at home." It is also known as the castle town of slopes. There are samurai houses on plateaus to the north and south and a merchant town sandwiched in the valley between them. This is a very rare shape for castle towns in the country, and it is said to be the only "sandwich-shaped castle town" in Japan.

### A Warakuan Kimono Rental

At Warakuan, you can rent your favorite kimono from among a selection of over 250 designs, and the staff will also help you put the kimono on. Admission is free to sightseeing facilities for those wearing a kimono. Please take lots of photos of yourself wearing a kimono.



### 1 The Kitsuki Shuraku-kan

At this theater, you can enjoy Japanese plays that have been passed down from long ago. There is a restaurant and a souvenir shop inside the theater, and you can take photos together with the actors.



### 2 Tenjin-zaka Slope

The view of the tiled roofs of the merchant houses from Tenjin Slope is very beautiful and a must-see. Climbing the slope, you will come to a very rare place in the country – a place of mystical energy where shrines, churches, and temples stand in rows.



### 3 Tera-machi

There are rows of temples in Teramachi, and these served as strongholds for the western part of the castle town. The temples were used as places for samurai to gather together during times of war. There are many things to see here such as the largest iron statue of Buddha in Japan and an elegant garden considered to be Kyushu's representative Japanese garden.



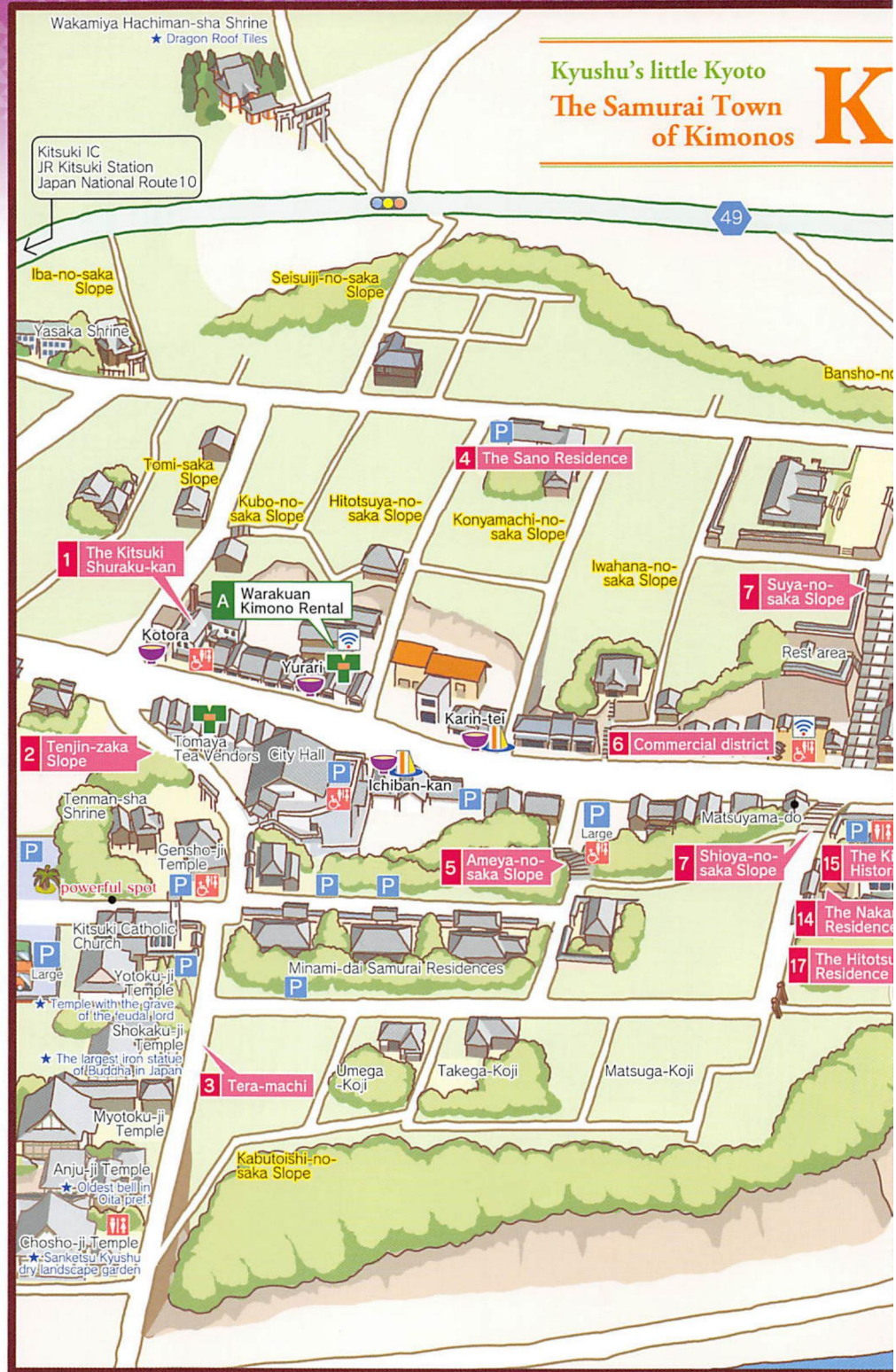
### 4 The Sano Residence

This is the home of the Sano family that served the town as doctors for 400 years. There is a basket hanging in the entrance way. This is the oldest of all the mansions remaining in the castle town.



### 5 Ameya-no-saka Slope

This slope forms a beautifully curved chevron, which is a rare shape among the slopes in Kitsuki. The slope connects the merchant town with the Minami-dai samurai home area, where you can still find stone walls and whitewashed walls.



### 6 Commercial district

There are many long-standing shops, such as tea shops and miso shops that have been around since ancient times, lining the streets of this merchant town, which retains the charm of Edo. Please enjoy the traditional tastes and craftsmanship.



### 7 Suya-no-saka Slope & Shioya-no-saka Slope

This wonderful view is often used for period dramas, TV dramas, and commercials. This is one of the most beautiful spots in all the castle towns in the entire country, and so this is the number one sightseeing spot.



### 8 Kita-dai Samurai Residences

The Kita-dai Samurai Home Area, where the samurai used to spend time, is the area that most retains the look of the Edo period. The rows of samurai homes are a wonderful sight.



### 9 The Ohara Residence

An elite family of samurai lived in this house during the Edo period. The elegant Japanese garden is also a must-see. Inside the home, you can take a commemorative photo holding a Japanese sword, and you can enjoy feeling like a samurai.

#### B Kitsuki Local Products Center

#### 14 The Nakane Residence

This charming home belonged to an elite samurai family, and the size of the grounds shows how prosperous they were at the time. The tea-ceremony rooms inside the house are still used to hold tea ceremonies.



#### 15 The Kitsuki Castle Town Historical Museum

Kitsuki flourished as a castle town, and a number of the town's treasures are on display here. The gorgeous carriage of a high-ranking person is on display in the entrance hall.



#### 16 Scenic lookout

This observation platform looks out over the sea and the castle tower of Kitsuki Castle, known as the smallest castle in Japan. It often appears on television. You will probably never forget the view from this wonderful spot.



#### 10 The Nomi Residence

There is a café inside this high-class samurai home, and you can relax as you enjoy sweets, etc. Please feel free to play the Japanese harp placed in the house and enjoy its sounds.



#### 12 The Isoya Residence

This was where the lord would rest. The marvelous Japanese garden shows the beauty of the seasons. Please take your time here. You may freely play the Japanese harp placed in the house and enjoy its sounds.



#### 11 The Clan School Gate (Hanko-no-mon)

The gate of the school where the samurai and their children studied and practiced martial arts was built in the Edo period, but is still looks exactly the same today, more than 200 years later. I hope you feel like a samurai as you pass through the gate.



#### 13 Kanjoba-no-saka Slope

This beautiful, straight slope connects Kitsuki Castle and the samurai homes. Among the stone steps, there are fan-shaped and Mt. Fuji-shaped stones. Please try to find them.



#### 17 The Hitotsumatsu Residence

This spot gives a wonderful view of Kitsuki Castle and the sea. Fabulous examples of Japanese architecture can be found throughout this luxuriously-built mansion.



#### 18 Kitsuki Castle

This is the smallest castle in Japan, and the highlight is the view of the sea from the castle tower. Take a commemorative photo dressed as a warrior in a real suit of armor and helmet.

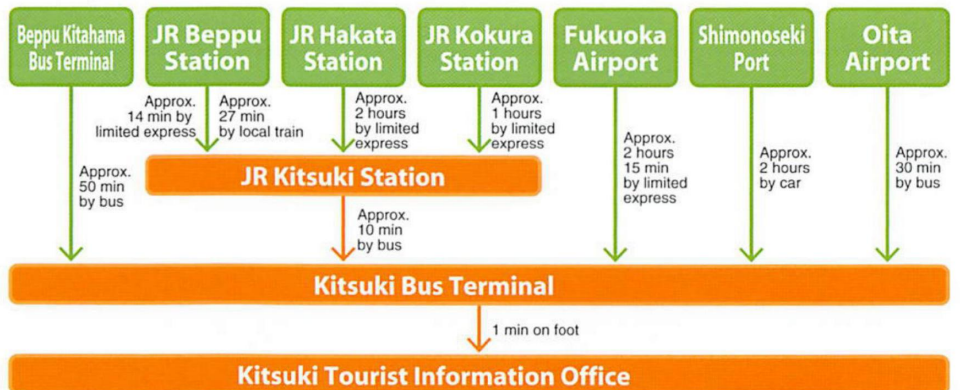
### Kitsuki Sandwich
